Site Emergency Arrangements

The Site Emergency Arrangements have not been activated since the last SSG meeting.

Trawsfynydd has withdrawn from the RADSAFE and NAIR scheme as a responding site and remains as a RADSAFE consignee site only.

Trawsfynydd has also withdrawn as the supporting site for Wylfa in the event of a nuclear emergency at Wylfa. Support for Wylfa will be provided by Oldbury. This new arrangement formed part of the Level 2 emergency exercise which took place in November 2013.

The updated Hazard Identification Risk Evaluation document (HIRE) has been presented to the ONR. This document states that there are no foreseeable faults that could lead to an off-site nuclear emergency, as defined under REPPIR, and the site has asked the ONR to consider whether a local authority off-site plan is required.

Our current arrangements will remain in place until the ONR informs the local authority of any change that it requires.

Emergency Scheme Staff

As part of the ongoing transition to care and maintenance, a number of long serving members of staff have left or are due to leave in the next year. Some of these individuals had emergency scheme duties. A recent recruitment drive for vacancies on the emergency scheme generated a good response. The scheme remains fully staffed and there are new members in training.

Training and Exercises

Command and control training for new emergency scheme staff has been carried out. The programme of shift exercises for scheme members continues will all shifts and standby teams having completed a full site exercise this year.

The level 1 demonstration exercise to the ONR takes place on Wednesday 25 June 2014.
