

**Report to the Trawsfynydd Site Stakeholder Group from the joint Wylfa/Trawsfynydd  
Emergency Planning Consultative Committee**

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Relevant agenda items from the EPCC held on 17 September 2013:

Site Emergency Arrangements

There have been no significant changes in the Site's emergency arrangements since the last SSG meeting. The Site Emergency Arrangements have not been activated since the last SSG meeting.

Trawsfynydd will withdraw from RADSAFE and NAIR as responders from 31 December 2013. The site remains a RADSAFE consignor.

A review of the safety case and hazards at Trawsfynydd site has resulted in an updated Hazard Identification Risk Evaluation document (HIRE). This high level document informs the emergency plans for Trawsfynydd. The HIRE and associated safety case work has established that there are no foreseeable faults that could lead to a significant off-site release. The revised document has been presented to the Nuclear Safety Committee. The next stage is formal presentation to the ONR to ask them to consider the ongoing requirement for off-site arrangements under REPPIR, which includes the arrangements for residents within the current Detailed Emergency Planning Zone. Our current arrangements will remain in place until the ONR informs the local authority of any change that it requires, and any changes will be fully communicated to stakeholders by Magnox and Gwynedd local authority.

Emergency Scheme Staff

The site is entering a transition phase and this has resulted in some scheme members leaving the site. The recruitment process undertaken in 2012 resulted in a pool of candidates who had expressed an interest in joining the scheme. A number of these candidates will now have opportunities to become emergency scheme members. At present there is no indication that transition will have an adverse effect on the scheme, however this is being monitored closely.

Training and Exercises

The demonstration exercise to the ONR took place on 26 June 2013. This was a daytime exercise involving a spill of two different types of contaminated material, and a contaminated casualty. The ONR and the Magnox Assurance Team judged the exercise an adequate demonstration of our emergency arrangements.
