



**WYLFA SITE STAKEHOLDER GROUP
SUMMARY OF KEY POINTS FROM THE MEETING
HELD ON THURSDAY 6 OCTOBER AT ELETH ROOM, WYLFA SITE**

Further detail is available in the full Minutes of the meeting.

- The Chair announced that he had been appointed as the Chair of the Magnox Site Stakeholder Groups Chairs.
- The Site Director reported that there had been no first aid incidents since the last meeting and that the Target Zero campaign had been launched.
- An update on current projects was presented in the Site Director's report, including collaboration on the manufacture of bespoke machinery to support the removal of Intermediate Level Waste from site as well as good progress being made on active effluence discharge line. Two fuel route equipment maintenance issues were also reported on, one of which had resulted in ONR involvement. It was reported that the Maentwrog site had performed above target since the last meeting due to heavy rainfall over the period. Updated Wylfa workforce figures were presented as well as details of work in the community. Gordon Malcolm would look into arranging a possible site visit for SSG members and inform the group of what type of visit could be hosted.
- The NDA update was presented by Jonathan Jenkin and it was reported that a claim for damages had been awarded against the NDA, which had been unsuccessful at its first appeal. Work on a further appeal had been initiated and was ongoing. The NDA reported on estates developments at other UK sites. The NDA expressed its disappointment with the focus of the recent BBC Panorama programme based on safety aspects of the Sellafield site. The NDA was reviewing ownership of the Maentwrog site and its associated assets. No decision or timetable had been made on this as yet and an update would be given as the review progressed.
- Arrangements would be made for an RWM presentation at the next meeting.
- Nick Blackburn presented the Office for Nuclear Regulation (ONR) report and stated that routine inspections were continuing with no significant issues having arisen and there were no immediate causes for concern.
- It was reported that redundancy payments may be limited for those in public employment and that Wylfa was awaiting detailed government proposals on which organisations the capping would affect. It was not yet known if Wylfa staff would be affected.
- Paul Wright presented the Natural Resources Wales (NRW) report and drew attention to discharges from Wylfa, which were within the limits set. NRW routine environmental monitoring showed no causes for concern. It was reported that no events or enforcement actions had been taken on Wylfa by NRW since the last meeting.
- Gordon Malcolm listed the various waste disposal operations to be carried out over the next few months, and that these would not create any more traffic than during previous normal operation.
- Details of the latest Magnox socio-economic scheme applications were presented by Mair Jones as was the current financial position of the scheme. Details of two large projects within the scheme to be discussed at the next SSG meeting.
