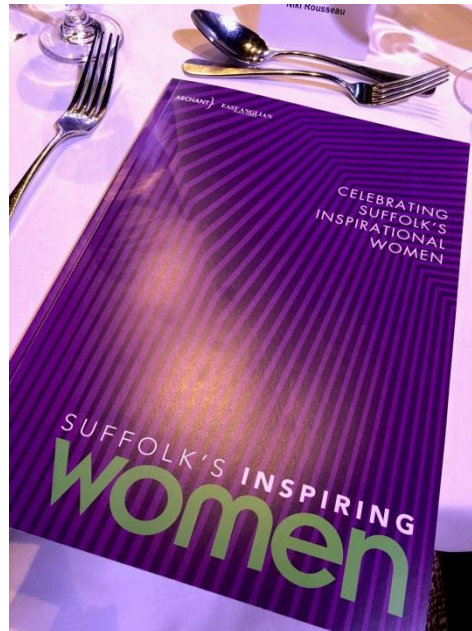
Nissan and EDF Energy partner to advance low carbon transport

- New partnership to explore combining Nissan second-life electric vehicle (EV) batteries with EDF Energy's demand side response platform, PowerShift.
- Millions of second-life EV batteries could be used to supply electricity to the grid and cut Britain's carbon emissions.
- Agreement also covers future collaboration across smart charging, batteries, decentralised generation and grid integration over the coming years.



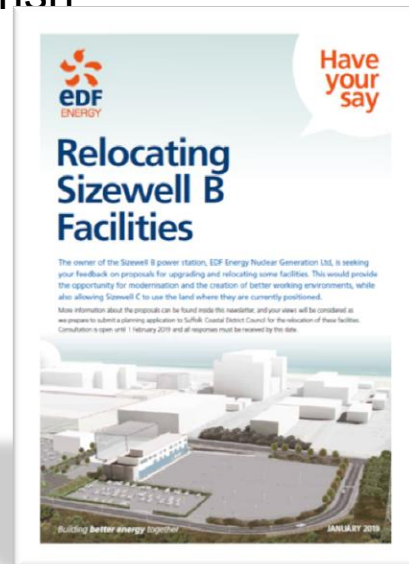
EDF Energy women named in Suffolk list of the most inspirational women in the county

- The East Anglian Daily Times newspaper launched the campaign in 2018 earlier to find the most inspirational women in Suffolk as part of the county's celebrations around the 100th anniversary of Emmeline Pankhurst's work to get the vote for women.

Sizewell B Relocated Facilities (RF)

- Environmental scoping report was submitted to Suffolk Coastal District Council in **October 2016** - proposals to relocate some non-nuclear buildings at Sizewell B
- Public consultation took place from **04 Jan – 01 Feb 2019** with the local community on the proposals:
 - Exhibition boards at two events (Friday 04 Jan – for Sizewell residents at the Visitors Centre 4-8pm) and Saturday 05 Jan – Leiston, United Reform Church 11-5pm).
 - A4 newsletter with outline proposals and how people respond distributed to residents within Leiston-cum-Sizewell Parish
 - Sizewell B's December Community Newsletter issued consultation information
 - Local residents meeting to outline proposals



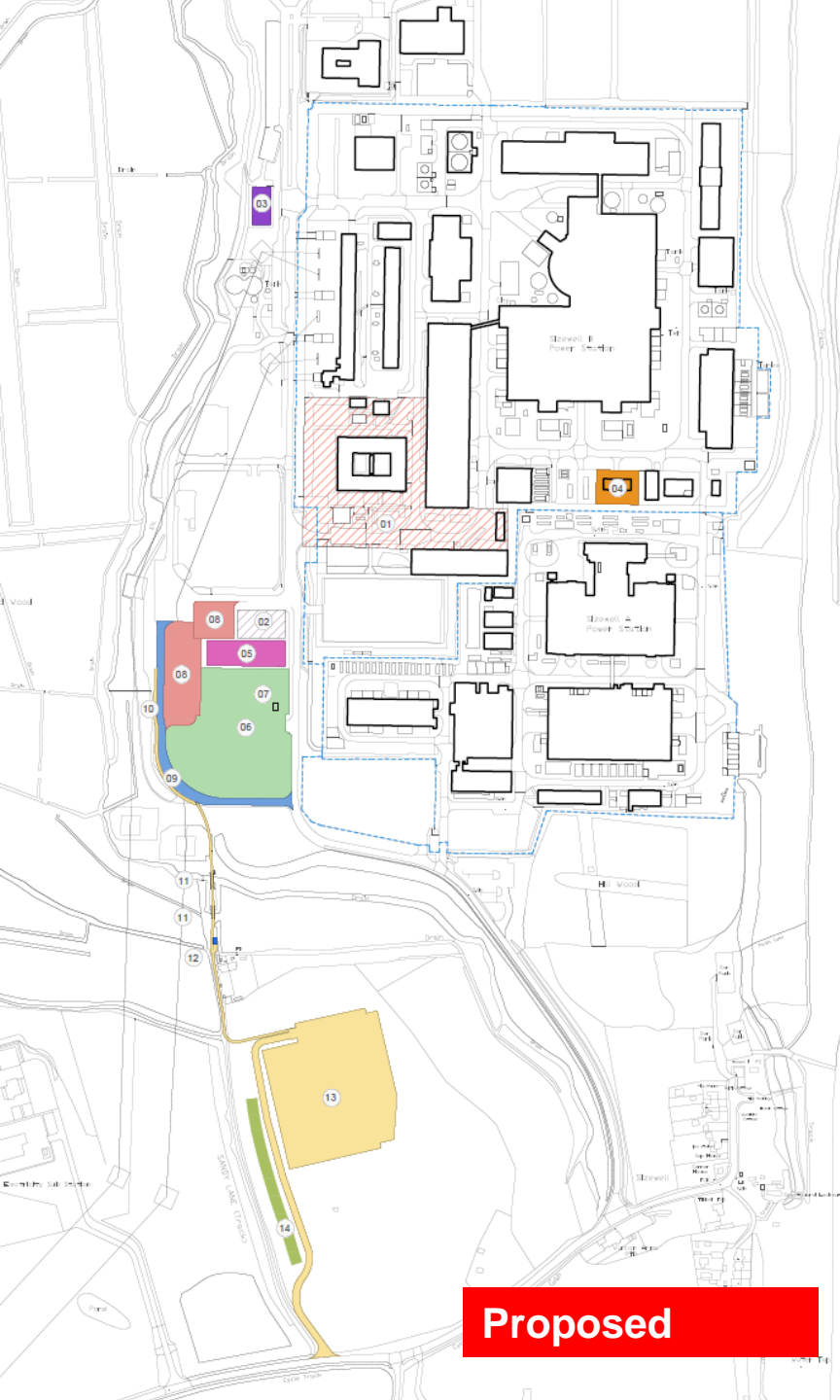

Relocated Facilities - what happens next?

- **106** responses received with a range of comments for consideration.
- We will consider each response individually, then incorporate our response and include in a **Statement of Community Consultation** which will accompany our planning application.
- There will be further opportunity to respond as part of the formal consultation that accompanies the planning submission.
- We will continue to engage with key stakeholders over this next period.
- Permission will be sought for Relocated Facilities (RF) through both the Town and Country Planning Act application and as part of the SZC Development Consent Order.
- Next Steps:
 - April 2019 Planning submission
 - August/Sept 2019 Planning application determination
 - Proposal for works starting in early 2020
