2. Approve the Minutes of the meeting held on 30 July 2020

Minutes of the meeting held on 30 July 2020 were presented and accepted as a correct record – (MB/AR). Minutes of the meeting held on 30 January 2020 were also presented for approval having being inadvertently omitted from the Agenda of 30 July 2020. These minutes were also confirmed as a correct record.

3. Matters arising from the minutes of the meeting held on 30.7.20

None raised

4. Chairman's Address – Keith O'Brien

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting and wished to thank the Site Director for keeping him updated on issues since the last meeting of the SSG during this difficult time due to COVID 19.

He referred to recent virtual meeting that had taken place since 30 July 2020.

- NDA Chair meeting 18 September 2020 – discussion was mostly around continuous decommissioning and he noted that it was pleasing that Trawsfynydd had been identified as the lead site.
- Magnox Chairs Meeting 27 November 2020 – the Chair noted that he was unable to attend this meeting; however, John Richards, Deputy Chair attended. JR stated that he had IT issues and was only able to connect for Gwen Parry Jones' overview which mainly referred to COVID 19 issues.
- A short virtual meeting was held on 2.12.20 with David Peattie and the newly appointed NDA Chair. He noted that it was an opportunity to express appreciation on behalf of the SSG regarding Trawsfynydd being nominated as the lead site for continuous decommissioning. The Chair also noted that he had stressed upon them the following:

- Blaenau Ffestiniog railway to remain on all upcoming agenda discussions as the railway is a key component for any future developments.

In response to a query from Roy Trappe about the railways future, the Chair reiterated the SSG's commitment to ensure the future of the railway

- Priority is given to the Welsh Language through positive discrimination in all discussions, communications and administrations. This is also key to delivering the Welsh Governments target of ensuring a million Welsh speakers by 2050
- The SSG welcomes leisure activities and maintenance of wildlife on the lake and further developments to be pursued in this direction.
-

The Chair also noted that the issue of a floatplane on the lake has now been referred to the Magnox legal team for resolution.

5. Site Closure Director's Report – Angharad Rayner

Angharad Rayner referred to the written report previously circulated within the meeting papers. She also wished to share a short staff information video on hand hygiene - 'Be like Graig' and noted that this was available on YouTube and for wider sharing upon request.

She summarised her report as follows:-

COVID 19

On 11 November it became necessary to quickly and proactively scale back a number of work activities and gradually reduce the number of employees on site as a result of a small number of employees testing positive for Covid-19 and some personnel in the local community being told by NHS Test & Trace to self-isolate. Staff worked in conjunction with the local authority Environmental Health Officer who complemented the response and agreed that all arrangements were robust. There was no evidence that anyone brought the virus onto site from a high risk area, however, monitoring individuals who come to the site from high risk areas continues. Face coverings have been introduced and air purifiers installed in welfare facilities and a review of new technologies that could help identify potential positive cases is ongoing.

Safety Focus

Number of days since a lost time accident: 1548

Monthly Target Zero safety campaigns have been held regarding electrical safety, fire safety and operational experience feedback which are the processes by which all sites seek to use lessons learned to improve safety and reliability and prevent a loss. This month's campaign focused on Equality Diversity and Inclusion, and the material was very powerful with positive feedback on the campaign. Last week the site underwent a Safeguards Inspection which also provided positive feedback on our arrangements for dealing with nuclear material.

Workforce Profile

11 local people have been recruited to support the increase in plant and structures work.

Site Progress

A new modular unit arrived in September to provide additional accommodation to ensure principle contractor Erith's compliance with Covid-19 social distancing and to enable normal operations to restart

A 130-tonne crane lifted the 17-tonne lead lined Camsey tank into a reinforced ISO container for transportation to the Studsvik metallic low level waste smelting facility in Sweden.

On 3 September, the ONR approved the Site's application for the completion of the latest milestone LC35.06 which is associated with the conclusion of the retrievals, processing and interim storage of all wet intermediate level waste (ILW) on site. The first low-level waste consignment since the operational pause was dispatched to Tradebe, Southampton in September. Fuel element debris (FED) retrievals also commenced in September, beginning with box seven in the south plant. Remote raking and retrieval of residual FED from the corners of the vaults is scheduled to run until mid-January in the north plant.

The £1.8 million project to upgrade the site's diversion culvert, pumping station and construct a new shared access road from the national grid compound is making great progress by contract partner JN Bentley

A faulty non-return valve in the site's sewage works sludge pumping system was replaced, following a lot of preparatory work to identify and source the correct valve due to historic modifications.

A redundant mixed bed tank from the historic active effluent treatment plant has been dismantled. This work involved size reducing and cleaning the tank and removing any residual resin.

Contract partner OBR commenced work to repair the Pen y Bryn office accommodation roof in September.

Reactor Bio-shield coring - Erith, in partnership with OBR, will undertake work over the coming months to remove three reactor bioshield cores through the full 3.1 metre concrete depth for radiological and chemical analysis.

The Chair thanked AR for her presentation and commended her delivery giving priority to the medium of Welsh.

6. Snowdonia Enterprise Zone – Dr John Idris Jones

Dr John Idris Jones was welcomed to the meeting and provided members with a brief update on Enterprise Zone developments as follows:-

Llanbedr

The site continues to develop. JIJ referred to the proposed increase in launch use, specifically, Rockoon where a balloon will be launched into the stratosphere.

The Welsh Ambulance Trust are utilising the site to trial drone use for delivering de-fibrillators to remote areas.

Work continues of the infrastructure for the Llanbedr by-pass.

Trawsfynydd

JIJ noted that the Snowdonia Enterprise Zone welcomed the lead role Trawsfynydd will now play in continuous de-commissioning.

He stated that progressing the joint working with both Magnox and NDA will advance the support for smaller innovative projects on the Site.

He also referred to the importance of positive partnerships between Bangor University and Coleg Menai Llandrillo. He reiterated that the Enterprise Zone Board is currently assessing the merits of SMR's. The Board also supports the continued use and maintenance of the Blaenau Ffestiniog railway branch line for future use.

Finally he referred to the Welsh Government's intention to establish a development company - to be known as Cwmni Eginio that will help exploit the economic benefits of small modular reactors and associated technologies on site, including the potential for a medical research reactor, to provide a secure and sustainable supply of medical radioisotopes for Wales, the UK and Europe.

7. Report by the Office for Nuclear Regulation – Ian Dallas

A written report was previously circulated with the papers and Mr Ian Dallas, who had tendered his apologies for this meeting, noted that he would be happy to respond to any queries/issues via email.

8. Report by Natural Resources Wales – Iwan Williams

Mr Iwan Williams was welcomed to the meeting. He explained that contact between both the Trawsfynydd site and NRW had been maintained virtually over the past few months. He also noted that there had been no significant environmental events since the last SSG meeting.

9. Environment Agency Report – Mike Baggs

Mike Baggs presented a written report circulated with the meeting papers on behalf of both organisations (NRW and EA) noting that it covered the period since the last Site Stakeholder Group (SSG) meeting on 30 July 2020. He outlined the following:-

- No visits undertaken to the Site due to COVID 19, however, routine engagement was undertaken virtually on a weekly or bi-weekly basis
- A number of compliance activities were not carried out in line with normal arrangements during the pause; however, Magnox Ltd provided a justification for these changes, which were considered reasonable

given the unprecedented circumstances associated with the pandemic and the government restrictions.

- A number of 'technical breaches' with the radioactive substances activity environmental permit were identified; however, these had no environmental impact.
- Magnox Ltd took a cautious approach to returning to site, which was set out in a detailed Quality Plan. Completion of the Quality Plan was monitored through routine regulatory interactions, and Magnox Ltd returned to full compliance by the end of September 2020.

The Chair thanked Mike Baggs for his update.

10. Report by the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority – Jonathan Jenkin

Mr Jenkin was welcomed to the meeting and provided a summary of the NDA report drawing particular attention to the following:-

COVID 19

JJ stated that the NDA Group continues to respond to the challenges presented by the pandemic. He reported good progress in restarting site operations across the NDA Group since the end of first lockdown. NDA Corporate Centre staff is continuing to work from home except essential office access/travel and that health, safety and wellbeing of staff remains the top priority

New Appointments

Dr Ros Rivaz, the newly appointed Chair took up the post with the NDA on 1 September 2020. She started her career in ExxonMobil, specialising in supply chain leadership and has worked in senior roles for Tate & Lyle, ICI, Diageo and Premier Foods and was Smith & Nephew's Global Chief Operating Officer from 2011-2014.

JJ also referred to the appointment of Francis Livens to NDA Board who has over 35 years' experience in nuclear research. He is a Professor of Radiochemistry and Director of University of Manchester Dalton Institute And a member of both the Nuclear Innovation & Research Advisory Board and ONR Independent Advisory Panel

National Audit Office (NAO) Report / Public Accounts Committee (PAC) Hearing

NAO published their report on the termination of the Magnox contract on 9 September 2020. JJ noted that it was pleasing the report recognised the successful way in which the NDA negotiated the end of the contract, in a very challenging set of circumstances, and recognised some important progress on the Magnox sites.

GDF Working Group

Radioactive Waste Management (RWM) has welcomed the formation of the first Working Group in Copeland regarded as an important step in the Geological Disposal Facility (GDF) programme. The Working Group will begin local discussions and fact-finding about potentially siting a GDF in

Copeland, however, this does not guarantee that a GDF will be sited in Copeland or preclude other communities from establishing Working Groups

NDA Draft Strategy 4

JJ reminded members that the NDA Strategy has to be reviewed at least every 5 years and that the current Strategy was published in 2016. Draft Strategy 4 published for public consultation from 17 August – 8 November with the final approved Strategy published by 31 March 2021. JJ described the two phases within the process as follows:-

- Pre-engagement phase
Information packs sent to key stakeholders
Virtual meetings (NGO Forum, SSG sub-groups, Theme Overview Groups etc.)
- Consultation phase
Full document published on gov.uk
Social media promotion of S4
Virtual meetings with stakeholders, including national stakeholder event, NGO Forum, NuLeAF etc.

To date approximately 70 sets of comments have been received from a range of stakeholders which will be carefully considered and, where possible, taken into account in the final draft

Draft Business Plan

The NDA Draft business plan will be published on 8 December 2020 and will set out the spending plans and priorities for financial years 2021 – 2024. It will undertake an 8 week public consultation period and members were invited to forward their comments.

Questions and Answer session

The Chair expressed some concern regarding the 8 week consultation period as this will include Christmas and New Year and might hinder responses. JJ acknowledged that this was a good point that he would take back to the NDA Group; however, he did note that the publication date of 31.3.20 is stated within the legislation timetable.

11. Ponds complex demolition project update – Ian Warner

Mr Ian Warner was welcomed to the meeting and provided an update report on the above summarised as follows:-

Progress update

- The Draft GRR “Lead and Learn” trial was in 2016/17
- An alternate draft site end state strategy was developed
- The new strategic approach was accepted by NDA in 2018
- The development work to support ponds complex demolition and associated on-site disposal is ongoing

- It is anticipated that all necessary permissions will be sought in 2021/2022 – COVID permitting
- Ponds complex demolition scheduled for 2024

Attaining the ponds complex End State

- Demolition Readiness End-state
The buildings are ready for demolition following de-planting
- Closure End-state
Buildings demolished and voids infilled, capped in accordance with engineering design
- Final End-state
Final landscaping completed at final site clearance

In conclusion

The GRR sets out regulatory aims for nuclear site clean-up:

- Optimised waste management plans
- Optimised waste disposal
- Environmental safety standards for surrender of permits

This enables sustainable management of radioactive waste from nuclear decommissioning and is part of the wider picture of UK Government and the Devolved Administration's plans for the final stages of nuclear decommissioning

Question and Answer session

JIJ thanked IW for his detailed presentation noting that the content described the steps to be taken to deal with waste in a sustainable way, proportionate to concerns. He enquired whether IW would be able to present to the Snowdonia Enterprise Zone and also asked if there will be any consultations on the site's future developments.

IW stated that he was happy to present to the Snowdonia Enterprise Zone Board and confirmed that consultation processes will be an integral part of developments.

The Chair thanked IW for his presentation and reiterated the benefits of continued open dialogue between all parties.

12. Continuous reactor Decommissioning – Sohail Ashraif

Mr Sohail Ashraif was welcomed to his first meeting as Programme Manager for Continuous Reactor Decommissioning. He noted that these were exiting times at Trawsfynydd having been identified as a pioneering site. He referred to the opportunities for innovative learning locally in engineering; project delivery; waste management and bulk demolition that will be rolled out UK wide and beyond. He described the Different Delivery vision using local resources as follows:

Steps taken

- Studies for reactor dismantling underway
- Plan developed for short term work
- Simultaneous delivery across multiple sites

Grand challenges

- Initiating the reactor decommissioning programme at Trawsfynydd
- Working with the Supply Chain to develop the most appropriate solution
- Investment and collaboration with new technology

Current focus

- A programme business case currently being prepared for the site specific strategies with a target submission date of March/April 2021
- Strategic outline case to be written for Trawsfynydd as the lead and learn site with a target submission date of September/October 2021

Question and Answer session

The Chair thanked SA for his clear and detailed presentation outlining the proposals for possible future developments.

John Idris Jones also thanked SA for his presentation and reiterated that collaborative working between all interested parties is paramount. He requested that North Wales companies should be positively engaged as the best legacy for the Trawsfynydd site would be local work for local people and a strong supply chain. SA noted that this was an opportunity for industries to grow with secure career paths and meaningful apprenticeships, and that the recent Webinar event augured well with a good cross section of contributors. He also noted that he was happy to meet with JIJ to discuss further outside the meeting.

Rory Trappe enquired as to the figures of staff/contractors on site? SA stated that he was unable to give figures at this preliminary stage but that they may become more apparent nearer March 2021. RT enquired as to whether there will be a Training Facility on site? SA confirmed that all possibilities will be explored. JIJ referred to the University of Sheffield's proposal to establish a National De-commissioning Centre and that if a hub and spoke model was adopted the Trawsfynydd site would be an ideal venue for a spoke. He urged Magnox and NDA to investigate this proposal.

13. Cwmni Ynni Cymunedol Twrog – Dafydd Watts

Mr Dafydd Watts was welcomed to the meeting and presented a brief update report on Cwmni Ynni Cymunedol Twrog. He noted the following:-

- Solar Panels have been installed on several social enterprise buildings within the catchment area
- How to heat Tanygrisiau – a tracking fuel poverty initiative with £25K raised for an initial appraisal study working in conjunction with Cwmni Bro Stiniog, Y Dref Werdd, Gyngor Gwynedd and Housing associations – Adra and Cynefin.

DW referred to the continued enthusiasm of members and their hard work. He thanked the Chair for the opportunity to present and noted that members were welcomed to contact him for any further details.

14. Magnox socio-economic scheme update – Mair Jones

Mair Jones was welcomed to the meeting and provided the following update on the socio-economic scheme:

In July, the NDA published its Local Social and Economic Impact Strategy for 2020. The strategy outlines the current approach to socio-economics and includes a consolidated view of improvements and amendments made over the last few years with the launch of the new grant funding scheme. This scheme is now open for applications under the 'One NDA' Grant System. This aligns the process and consistency across the NDA estate.

The format for grants remains the same with funding of up to £1,000 (good neighbour level), while larger requests, and those for multi-year funding, of up to £200,000 are expected to comply with a range of criteria aimed at creating resilient economies, thriving communities, sustainable incomes and growth for our communities.

Back in April 2020, Magnox and the NDA announced a £25,000 cash boost to help support vulnerable groups surrounding the sites with Covid-19 related activities. As part of this funding, to date Gwynedd Council have received and distributed over £15,000 to support the community during the pandemic on behalf of Magnox. The funding purchased PPE for volunteers; a 3D printer and materials for Coleg Meirion Dwyfor to produce visors for care workers; a hot water boiler and freezers for South Gwynedd Food Bank to cope with additional demand; food provisions and fridges for Grandma's Attic foodbank and baby boxes providing essential supplies for families in need.

Groups that have benefited from the good neighbour funding are:

- Blaenau Ffestiniog Rugby Club received £600 to purchase a new line marking machine for the club.
- Blaenau Ffestiniog Amateur Football Club 20 community volunteers helped 'The Quarrymen' to achieve their aim of being granted a Football Association of Wales tier three licence following a £20,000 investment to improve the Cae Clyd amenities. New spectator barriers, concrete footpaths, a covered seating stand for 100 people, a PA system and welfare facilities have all been installed with the help of £1,000 contribution from Magnox.
- Llanuwchllyn Football Club recently received £1,000 towards the new 100 seat spectator stand, having raised a further £16,000 to also ensure meeting the new criteria of the Welsh Football Association.

Some of the larger, transformational applications with continued support:

- STEM Gogledd Project also received approval for the next tranche of funding. The programme was given a further £50,250 to continue the third year. Magnox have supported the project with a contribution of £201,000 over four years towards the £2m project. The project is progressing well with 17 schools now engaged. The three mentors covering Anglesey, Gwynedd and Conwy have built up a good working relationship with the schools, local employers and organisations and held over 40 successful events to date. Unfortunately the event arranged at Trawsfynydd site in March was cancelled due to the Covid-19 pandemic lockdown. The team have been proactive and adapted to a new way of working, setting up online virtual events using Zoom and 1:1 sessions with students. They worked on eight topics during the lockdown, with follow on activities that children could carry out at home.
- The Outdoor Partnership - a further £36,000 has been released to support the five year £1.5m Pathways to Employment project for a second year. Last year, this award winning programme provided access to outdoor activity taster experiences for over 1,600 people with disabilities, of which 115 participants suffering with mental health issues. The project also supported 35 indirect employment opportunities within the great outdoors. The project has also been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic lockdown, but they are working closely with Welsh Government on a post Covid recovery plan to hopefully get back to the outdoors safely in the next few months. Services have continued albeit on a smaller scale and engaging with participants via online channels, carrying out courses such as first aid and bicycle maintenance sessions. A couple of staff are on standby to voluntarily assist the NHS by taking suspected Covid patients to the local Bryn Beryl community hospital in Pwllhelli for testing in their specially adapted minibus if required. The programme is concentrating on reactivating a pilot 'Healthy and Active' project, working with mental health teams in the area; a 12 week Pathways to Employment programme for 18-24 year old unemployed individuals from Anglesey and Gwynedd and a project working with special need schools helping staff with risk assessments and use of sports equipment safely giving them confidence to be more sustainable in the future. The Outdoor Partnership is also helping prepare local sports clubs to re-open safely. The Volunteer Programme with Snowdonia National Park is now offering free membership, encouraging people to sign up.

The Chair thanked Mair Jones for her presentation and for the excellent work undertaken by the team in administrating these important community grants. Members were encouraged to promote the grants within their communities.

15. AOB

The Chair apologised that he had not welcomed Huw Jones from the Farmers Union of Wales as a new member at the meeting, and Huw had unfortunately had to leave the meeting before the end. We hope to see him again in the New Year.

The Chair wished all a Happy Christmas and prosperous New Year and closed the meeting at 12.20

Gofynnodd am i gwmnïau Gogledd Cymru gael eu cynnwys mewn modd cadarnhaol gan mai'r gwaddol gorau ar gyfer safle Trawsfynydd fyddai gwaith lleol i bobl lleol a chadwyn gyflenwi gref. Dywedodd SA fod hwn yn gyfle i ddiwydiannau dyfu gyda llwybrau gyrfa diogel a phrentisiaethau ystyrlon, a bod y digwyddiad Gweminar diweddar yn argoeli'n dda gyda thrawstoriad da o gyfranwyr. Nododd hefyd ei fod yn fodlon cyfarfod â JIJ i drafod ymhellach y tu allan i'r cyfarfod.

Holodd Rory Trappe ynghylch nifer y staff/contractwyr ar y safle? Dywedodd SA nad oedd yn gallu rhoi ffigurau ar y cam rhagarweiniol hwn ond y gallent ddod yn fwy amlwg yn nes at fis Mawrth 2021. Holodd RT a fydd Cyfleuster Hyfforddi ar y safle? Cadarnhaodd SA y byddai pob posibilrwydd yn cael ei archwilio. Anogodd Magnox a'r NDA i ymchwilio i'r cynnig hwn.

13. Cwmni Ynni Cymunedol Twrog – Dafydd Watts

- Mae Paneli Solar wedi cael eu gosod ar sawl adeilad yn perthyn i fenter gymdeithasol yn y dalgylch
- Sut mae gwresogi Tanygrisiau – menter olrhain tloidi tanwydd gyda £25K wedi'i godi ar gyfer astudiaeth arfarnu gychwynnol yn gweithio ar y cyd â Chwmni Bro Stiniog, Y Dref Werdd, Gwynedd a Chymdeithasau Tai – Adra a Cynefin.

Cyfeiriodd DW at frwdfrydedd parhaus yr aelodau a'u gwaith caled. Diolchodd i'r Cadeirydd am y cyfle i gyflwyno a nododd fod croeso i'r aelodau gysylltu ag ef i gael rhagor o fanylion.

14. Y diweddaraf am gynllun economaidd-gymdeithasol Magnox - Mair Jones

Croesawyd Mair Jones i'r cyfarfod, a rhoddodd y wybodaeth ddiweddaraf am y cynllun economaidd-gymdeithasol:

Ym mis Gorffennaf, cyhoeddodd yr NDA ei Strategaeth Effaith Gymdeithasol ac Economaidd Leol ar gyfer 2020. Mae'n amlinellu'r dull presennol o ymdrin ag economeg gymdeithasol ac yn cynnwys barn gyfunol ar welliannau a newidiadau a wnaed dros y blynyddoedd diwethaf yn sgil lansio'r arian grant newydd. Mae'r cynllun hwn ar agor yn awr i geisiadau dan System Grant 'Un NDA'. Mae hyn yn sicrhau proses gyson ar draws ystâd yr NDA.

Mae fformat y grantiau'n aros yr un fath gyda chyllid hyd at £1,000 (lefel cymydog da), ac mae disgwyl i geisiadau mwy, a cheisiadau am gyllid am sawl blwyddyn, o hyd at £200,000 gydymffurfio ag amrywiaeth o feini prawf sydd â'r nod o greu economïau cydnerth, cymunedau ffyniannus, incwm cynaliadwy a thwf ar gyfer ein cymunedau.

Yn ôl ym mis Ebrill 2020, cyhoeddodd Magnox a'r NDA hwb ariannol o £25,000 i helpu i gefnogi grwpiau o amgylch y safleoedd a oedd angen help gyda gweithgareddau'n ymwneud â Covid-19. Fel rhan o'r cyllid hwn, mae Cyngor Gwynedd wedi derbyn a dosbarthu dros £15,000 hyd yma i helpu'r gymuned yn ystod y pandemig, ar ran Magnox. Roedd y cyllid wedi prynu Cyfarpar Diogelu Personol (PPE) ar gyfer gwirfoddolwyr; peiriant argraffu 3D a deunyddiau ar gyfer Coleg Meirion Dwyfor i gynhyrchu feisorau i weithwyr gofal; boeler dŵr poeth a rhewgelloedd i Fanc Bwyd De Gwynedd i ymdopi â'r galw ychwanegol; bwyd ac oergelloedd ar gyfer banc bwyd Grandma's Attic a blychau babanod sy'n darparu eitemau hanfodol i deuluoedd mewn angen.

Dyma rai o'r grwpiau sydd wedi elwa o'r cyllid cymydog da:

- Cafodd Clwb Rygbi Blaenau Ffestiniog £600 i brynu peiriant newydd i farcio llinellau ar gyfer y clwb.
- Bu 20 o wirfoddolwyr cymunedol o Glwb Pêl-droed Amatur Blaenau Ffestiniog yn helpu'r 'Chwarelwyr' i gyrraedd eu nod o gael trwydded haen tri gan Gymdeithas Bêl-droed Cymru, yn dilyn buddsoddiad o £20,000 i wella cyfleusterau Cae Clyd. Mae rhwystrau newydd ar gyfer y dorf, llwybrau troed congrid, eisteddled dan do ar gyfer 100 o bobl, system uchelseinydd a chyfleusterau lles wedi cael eu gosod, gyda chymorth cyfraniad o £1,000 gan Magnox.

- Yn ddiweddar, cafodd Clwb Pêl-droed Llanuwchllyn £1,000 tuag at yr eisteddle newydd ar gyfer 100 o bobl, ar ôl codi £16,000 yn rhagor i sicrhau bod y Clwb hefyd yn bodloni meini prawf newydd Cymdeithas Bêl-droed Cymru.

Dyma rai o'r ceisiadau trawsnewid mwy o faint sy'n cael cymorth parhaus:

- Cafodd Prosiect STEM y Gogledd hefyd ei gymeradwyo ar gyfer y rownd nesaf o gyllid. Rhoddwyd £50,250 arall i'r rhaglen i barhau â'r drydedd flwyddyn. Mae Magnox wedi cefnogi'r prosiect drwy gyfrannu £201,000 dros bedair blynedd tuag at y prosiect sydd werth £2m. Mae'r prosiect yn dod yn ei flaen yn dda, gyda 17 ysgol bellach yn cymryd rhan. Mae'r tri mentor sy'n gwasanaethu Ynys Môn, Gwynedd a Chonwy wedi meithrin perthynas waith dda gyda'r ysgolion a gyda mudiadau a chyflogwyr lleol, ac wedi cynnal dros 40 o ddigwyddiadau llwyddiannus hyd yma. Yn anffodus, cafodd y digwyddiad a oedd wedi'i drefnu ar gyfer safle Trawsfynydd ym mis Mawrth ei ganslo oherwydd y cyfyngiadau symud yn sgil pandemig Covid-19. Mae'r tîm wedi bod yn rhagweithiol ac wedi addasu i ffordd newydd o weithio, gan gynnal digwyddiadau ar-lein drwy ddefnyddio Zoom a sesiynau un-i-un gyda myfyrwyr. Buont yn gweithio ar wyth pwnc yn ystod y cyfyngiadau symud, gyda gweithgareddau dilynol y gallai plant eu gwneud gartref.
- Y Bartneriaeth Awyr Agored - mae £36,000 arall wedi cael ei ryddhau i gefnogi'r prosiect pum mlynedd, Llwybrau at Waith, gwerth £1.5m am ail flwyddyn. Y llynedd, darparodd y rhaglen glodwiw hon brofiadau blasu gweithgareddau awyr agored i dros 1,600 o bobl ag anableddau; o'r rhain roedd gan 115 o'r cyfranogwyr broblemau iechyd meddwl. Fe wnaeth y prosiect hefyd gefnogi 35 o gyfleoedd cyflogaeth anuniongyrchol yn yr awyr agored. Mae cyfyngiadau symud Covid-19 wedi effeithio ar y prosiect hefyd, ond maen nhw'n gweithio'n agos gyda Llywodraeth Cymru ar gynllun adfer ar ôl Covid i ddychwelyd i'r awyr agored yn ddiogel yn ystod y misoedd nesaf. Mae gwasanaethau wedi parhau er eu bod ar raddfa lai ac yn golygu ymgysylltu â chyfranogwyr drwy sianeli ar-lein, gan gynnal cyrsiau fel cymorth cyntaf a sesiynau cynnal a chadw beiciau. Mae cwpl o staff wrth gefn i gynorthwyo'r GIG yn wirfoddol drwy fynd â chleifion yr amheuir bod Covid arnynt i ysbyty cymunedol lleol Bryn Beryl ym Mhwlheli i'w profi yn eu bws mini sydd wedi'i addasu'n arbennig, os bydd angen. Mae'r rhaglen yn canolbwyntio ar ailysgogi prosiect peilot 'Iach ac Egniol', sy'n gweithio gyda thimau iechyd meddwl yn yr ardal; rhaglen Llwybrau at Waith 12 wythnos ar gyfer unigolion 18-24 oed di-waith o Ynys Môn a Gwynedd a phrosiect sy'n gweithio gydag ysgolion anghenion arbennig sy'n helpu staff gydag asesiadau risg a defnyddio offer chwaraeon yn ddiogel gan roi hyder iddynt i fod yn fwy cynaliadwy yn y dyfodol. Mae'r Bartneriaeth Awyr Agored hefyd yn helpu i baratoi clybiau chwaraeon lleol i ailagor yn ddiogel. Mae'r Rhaglen Wirfoddoli gyda Pharc Cenedlaethol Eryri nawr yn cynnig aelodaeth am ddim, gan annog pobl i gofrestru.

Diolchodd y Cadeirydd i Mair Jones am ei chyflwyniad ac am y gwaith rhagorol a wnaed gan y tîm yn gweinyddu'r grantiau cymunedol pwysig hyn. Anogwyd yr aelodau i hyrwyddo'r grantiau yn eu cymunedau.
