1 Welcome and receive apologies for absence

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting at 3.15pm. Apologies were noted as above. He welcomed members from both Rhosybol and Llanelian Community Councils to their first meeting. He also welcomed Rhun ap Iorwerth the Island's Assembly Member.

2 Election of Chair and Vice Chair

Jill Callander, SSG Secretariat Co-ordinator noted that two nominations had been received and as there was no challenge to either of these nominations, Cllr Aled Morris Jones would remain as Chair with Cllr Derek Owen would replace Cllr G Winston Roberts as Vice Chair. The Chair wished to thank Cllr G W Roberts for his support and wished Cllr D Owen well in office.

3 Approval of minutes of the meeting held 31 January 2019

The minutes had been circulated prior to the meeting. Cllr G W Roberts proposed that the minutes were correct and the proposal was seconded by Cllr Ken Hughes. The minutes were received and accepted as a true record.

4 Matters arising from the previous minutes

Cestyll Gardens – The Chair noted that discussions were ongoing between the NDA and the National Trust. Enid Jones enquired as to why some trees, that provided shelter in the gardens, had been cut down. **ACTION - AMJ agreed to enquire further in order to provide an accurate response.**

Cllr Dafydd Griffiths requested an update on the Holliday Report. The Chair noted that legal obligations as well as Mr Holliday's ill-health have delayed publication.

5 SSG Chairman's Report

The Chair gave an overview of his activities since the last meeting and drew particular attention to:

- The NDA National Stakeholder Summit at Coleg Menai 9 & 10 of July 2019 - first time the NDA Summit has been held on Ynys Mon. A very successful event when delegates far and wide were able to see the resources here on Anglesey.
- Discussions ongoing with NDA regarding the future stewardship of Cestyll Gardens, Cemaes.
- Attended Magnox socio-economic scheme grant funding panel meetings.
- Attended briefings with the Wylfa Site Director
- Instigated the drafting of a Magnox, National UK covenant, the social licence to operate in the communities surrounding the various sites, in my role as Chair of the UK NDA SSG Forum.



6. Wylfa Site Director's Report

Stuart Law (SL) presented his report. Copies of the report had been forwarded to SSG members and were also available at the meeting. In summary, Mr Law referred to:

Site operations and key projects

SL reported that the defuelling programme forecast completion dates were reset in February as:

- Reactor 2 empty of spent fuel end July 2019 (achieved 13 June)
- Reactor 1 empty of spent fuel end August 2019

All spent fuel off site end September 2019

ONR fuel free verification declaration end October 2019.

He noted that defuelling performance has excelled throughout the period with many milestones met as the programme nears its conclusion.

Legacy waste reduction

A programme of work is underway to remove redundant ISO containers, portacabins and equipment from across the site that accumulated during operational years. Teams have been mobilised to safely dispose of this legacy waste over the coming months, most of which will be managed in-house with minimal Tier 2 contractor partner support.

Environment, Health, Safety, Security and Quality (EHSS&Q)

Total recorded incident rate (TRIR): 0.00

Days away case rate (DACR): 0.00

No of days since a lost time accident: 421

On 10 July 2019, Wylfa Site achieved the delivery of one year of work without a Lost Time Accident. This is an excellent achievement and means that the TRIR and DACR are both zero.

Visits

The Magnox MD and Deputy MD visited in May to review performance on the fuel route. It was an excellent visit and they were very appreciative of the hard work and commitment given to complete the defuelling programme.

People

On 21 August there were 288 employees and 22 Agency Supplied Workers on site (not including Security or Magnox Support Office staff based at Wylfa). The collective consultation phase of the staff transition process from the defuelling phase to the care and maintenance preparation phase structure began in February 2019. The Individual consultation phase, where staff recorded their preference to stay, transfer to another site or leave, was completed in May following which the redundancy selection process was conducted and letters issued. 85% of the workforce have been given their first choice and where individuals wish continued employment in Magnox, every effort is ongoing to offer alternative options eg: transfers to another Magnox site. Going forward there will be 175 employees on site in the new structure effective from 1 December.

The main focus of work will be post operational clean out and hazard reduction. For



example draining the oil from the fuelling machines and transporter systems. A total 88 tonnes of redundant equipment had recently been removed from site, including 18 portacabins two of which were donated to Cemaes FC. There are 184 buildings on site now, but when the site enters the Care & Maintenance phase in 2026 there will be just three: the reactor equipment building and the dry store cell four and five buildings.

Question and Answer session

Cllr G O Jones wished to thank SL for the site visit undertaken by SSG members preceding the meeting. He stated that it was good to see that the highest degree of safety remains part of the site's culture. He also valued the utilisation of local companies and skills whenever possible. Cllr Jones enquired as to how long the workforce of 175 would be maintained. SL noted that this was dependent on NDA strategy and the funding profile; however, he stated that it was his strategy to utilise as many as possible but that some aspects of the work may not be managed in-house such as demolition and asbestos removal.

Mr Law was thanked for his detailed update report.

7. Nuclear Decommissioning Authority Update

Mr J Jenkin was welcomed to the meeting and referred to the following:-

- NDA has announced funding of £495,000 to help support the County Council's North Anglesey Economic Regeneration Plan and create new economic opportunities on the island. This funding will contribute to measures aimed at boosting business activity, the supply chain and employment, increasing tourism, improving transport and infrastructure and reviving the High Street. Also noted an increased contribution to the Capel Bethlehem project (£300k).
- Magnox now a subsidiary company of the NDA with Gwen Parry-Jones appointed as CEO.
- Confirmed that the judicial review of the Holliday Report remains ongoing.

Question and Answer session

Cllr Dafydd Griffiths referred to the Annual Review of Accounts for 2018-19 and in particular Q2 which refers to the end of year achievements. He enquired as to how these targets can be achieved in light of the significant risks identified within the Holliday Report. JJ stated that he had not yet seen this particular reference, however, he would report back on this issue at the next SSG meeting. **ACTION – JJ to report back.**

Cllr K Hughes highlighted that the NDA spoke to SSG Chairs and Vice Chairs that looked at reports to consider a change in decommissioning Strategy. JJ commented that a high level business case had been presented to the NDA Board for consideration and a more detailed Business Case would be needed for Government approval.

Cllr G W Roberts wished to congratulate the NDA on their first successful summit on Anglesey. He also enquired as to the capital/revenue ratio of the £495,000 North Anglesey



Economic Regeneration Plan funding. JJ stated that the funding could be both and that it was to support the North Anglesey Regeneration projects. GWR hoped that most would be capital not revenue and reiterated his previous comments at this meeting that not enough media promotion is given to this invaluable funding.

The Chair went on to welcome Bill Hamilton to the meeting in his new role as Communications and Stakeholder Relations Director for Magnox. Mr Hamilton stated that Socio-Economic development was part of his remit and that he looked forward to working with all SSG members.

T Conway stated that he did not consider that the reactor equipment building's cladding was fit for another 50 years. SL replied that the reactor roof was redone five years ago, cladding is subject to regular maintenance within the Lifetime Plan.

T Conway asked if there were any plans to reduce the height of the reactor equipment building. SL replied that there aren't any plans for this.

T Conway enquired as to when the jetty and green navigator light will be removed. SL confirmed that all this work forms part of the Lifetime Plan, and that the work involved is ongoing and the SSG will be updated accordingly.

8. Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

Mr Ian Dallas was welcome to his first meeting of the SSG. He referred to the report for the period 1 January – 30 June 2019 which had been previously circulated to members. The following was noted:-

and stated that the ONR judged the arrangements made and implemented by the site in response to safety requirements to be adequate in the areas inspected.

Other work

- ONR's site inspector attended the Welsh region emergency planning consultative committee meeting that provides a forum for those agencies with responsibilities under Wylfa and Trawsfynydd's off-site emergency plan.
- ONR met Wylfa senior leadership team to discuss Wylfa's transition into



“contingency arrangements” following fuel free verification of the Wylfa site.

- ONR has written to all nuclear licensees to explain our expectations during the 12 month transition period concerning compliance with these new regulations.
- ONR’s site inspector held a planned meeting with safety representatives, to support their function of representing employees and receiving information on matters affecting their health, safety and welfare at work.

Question and Answers Session

9. Natural Resources Wales update

No representative in attendance but members received and accepted the report provided within the papers.

10. Wylfa Waste Management update

Mr Law provided a brief update during Item 6 recorded above

11. Magnox socio-economic scheme update

Mair Jones gave a short presentation on the achievements of the socio-economic scheme. She noted that seven applications have been supported from communities surrounding Wylfa site this financial year. A total of £102,571 had been allocated through the scheme. An additional £895,000 NDA direct funding has also been committed to the area with £400,000 for Menter Môn’s Morlais Tidal Project and £495,000 to Isle of Anglesey County Council to deliver the North Anglesey Regeneration Plan.

Groups that have benefited from the **Good Neighbour level funding** are:

- Cemaes Bay football Club- received £484 to purchase training equipment and a burger grill which will assist with raising funds for the club during their home matches.
- Môtage, Anglesey Writers – Following a successful event in 2017, Môtage are holding a second Writing Festival, 9 November, in Ysgol David Hughes Menai Bridge. The group received £406 towards tutor costs for seven literature workshops and publicity materials.
- Cemaes Carnival were also awarded £901 towards reusable Magnox branded vinyl banners, Magnox branded high-viz tabards for the carnival marshals and 24 plastic chairs for visitors inside the marquee.
- Cybi Striders had another successful annual 5k event at Holyhead Breakwater Park in July. They received £130 from the scheme to purchase locally supplied wooden carved trophies for the participants.

Update on the larger, ongoing transformational projects supported:

- Môn Communities Forward - On 28 June, Magnox attended the official opening of Môn Communities Forward’s (Môn CF) refurbished offices in Holyhead. Môn CF received Welsh Government funding to purchase their current office building on the



high street along with the old Cybi Electrical building to re-house the Training Academy in the town centre. Magnox funding supported the transition of the Academy with £300k from the Socioeconomic Scheme over three years.

- NDA directly funded: Menter Mon - secured a further £400,000 from the scheme over the next two years for the second phase of the Morlais Tidal Energy Demonstration Zone Project. They received £300,000 Magnox funding previously for pre-licencing, feasibility studies and consent work in preparation to develop the zone, where they will manage and sub-let areas to Global Tidal Technology developers. Magnox funding assisted the project successfully securing almost £5m WEFO (Welsh European Funding Office) and EU funding. This next phase will put the necessary infrastructure in place for developers of tidal stream energy converters to test their technology on a commercial scale. The NDA direct funding for the two year consent and licencing process has attracted £486,000 match funding from WEFO. This will see around £29m of investment during the main build and development phase and ensure the project is shovel ready by January 2021 and operational by the end of 2022. This will enable tidal developers to deploy their turbines from the zone and connect to Grid infrastructure. This allied with grid connection agreements, supply chain activity and commitment from the Global Technology Developers is ensuring Anglesey is the leading location for tidal stream energy.
- Isle of Anglesey County Council - NDA's pledge of £495,000 for North Anglesey Regeneration Plan. Last year, as part of the Energy Island Programme Phase 3, Isle of Anglesey County Council (IACC) commissioned a survey for North Anglesey. With £38,500 Magnox funding, it formed the preparation of a much needed Regeneration Plan for the area. With over 600 responses, the results highlighted a set of priorities viewed by the local communities. The plan also considered the suspended operation of Wylfa Newydd, the closure of Rehau, along with the completion of the defuelling phase here at Wylfa. The following themes were identified:
 - Support jobs and businesses
 - Develop tourism
 - Improve the high street/ retail/ tackle empty buildings
 - Improve transport/ road infrastructure
 - Make use of coastal areas/ heritage/ culture assets
 - Make use of disused railway line and old industrial sites

With match funding from IoACC and the Welsh Government a total of £1.01m will be invested in North Anglesey over the next three years.

Previous Magnox funding of £400,000 invested through IoACC has leveraged over £24m in other areas of Anglesey, with projects such as the Holyhead Port; Llangefni link road; new business units in Llangefni, all occupied with local businesses and 10 business units currently being built in Holyhead.

Question and Answer Session

12. Open Forum Question and Answer Session

TC also wished, as a representative of this meeting, to record that he deplores the decision of the Government and NDA regarding the decommissioning of Thorpe. The Chair acknowledged Mr Conway's personal view which will be relayed to the NDA.

13. Any Other Business

The Chair welcomed Ifer Gwyn as Horizon's representative on the SSG. Mr Ifer Gwyn thanked the Chair and updated members on the Wylfa Newydd position. He noted that there remained 20 members of staff working for Horizon located both at site and in offices in Gloucester. Steve Roberts, also in attendance and based at site, is the Site Supervisor. He stated that judgement on the Development Consent Order application is expected 24.10.19. The Chair confirmed that updates from Horizon will be a standing agenda item for this group.

The Vice Chair thanked the Site Director for the site tour in the morning.

Cllr Ken Hughes congratulated the Chair on being re-elected and for his presentation at the NDA Summit.

G W Roberts complained about the poor sound quality in the room. **ACTION – microphone to be available at future meetings.**

The Chair thanked all for their attendance and closed the meeting at 4:30pm
