Safety and Compliance

- Operational pause 19th March in response to Covid-19.
- 24hr security maintained, other staff working from home.
- Return commenced 1st June.
- Site now back to normal operations.
- Currently 201 Magnox staff on site: made up of 156 Sizewell staff and 45 Magnox support office staff



Covid-19: impact on Magnox fleet

- Mid-March: All Magnox sites into pause
- Essential work only + safety/security compliance
- Now lifted
- Gradual return to sites
- Covid security measures in place
- Prepared to reinstate if required
- PPE donations: 130,000 items in total across 12 sites



Covid-19: supporting the community

- Delivering prescriptions
- Transporting blood for NHS
- Marshalling traffic at doctors' surgeries
- Helping foodbanks
- Crocheting ear-savers to ease face-mask discomfort



Management of Bradwell

The annual inspection and maintenance programme at Bradwell commenced on 14th Sept and is planned to last for 3 weeks.



Plant and Structures Programme update

KDC to mobilise 19th October 2020 to commence removing:

- 6 reserve feedwater tanks
- Fire hydrant tank
- Towns main tank
- Associated pipework and building 58 (North ACP)



Ponds Programme update

- Following the successful draining of the ponds, the team are now processing the collected debris from the floor.
- Once the debris has been sorted, it will be consigned to either a Shielded Transfer Pot or an Miscellaneous Contaminated Items basket as either LLW or ILW & transferred to the Waste Team.
- Work will then continue to further decontaminate and stabilise the pond walls and floor.



Asset Care Projects

- The 'FIN' (Fix It Now) asbestos team will continue into 2020/21 – targeting small-scale asbestos works
- Small number of projects started to upgrade staff working conditions.



Asset Care Projects

- Bird netting of SAB (Sizewell Admin Building), training facility, welfare/workshop & LLW buildings completed before pause: very successful
- Continued removal of legacy scaffolds
- Covid-19 arrangements in place to protect staff, contractors and visitors, ensuring social distancing



What next ...

- Our priorities continue to be safe asset care – ensuring the fabric of buildings and plant do not degrade to present a hazard to our workforce or the environment
- This year:
 - Commence isolation of the turbine hall
 - Strike and removal of legacy scaffolds
 - Removal of redundant equipment from site
 - Continuation of ponds programme
 - Commence removal of scaffold C&D boilers
 - Removal of reserve feed tanks
 - Various asset care programme works

Socio-economics – 2020/21

- £87,000 to Saxmundham Art Station (NDA direct funding)
- £25,000 made available to support Covid-19 initiatives (each site)
- £64,203 to five socio-economic projects:
 - Kesgrave Kestrels U-12s football team
 - Leiston FC – tournament medals
 - East Suffolk Council food and drink promotional event
 - East Suffolk Council, East Suffolk Business Association and Town Group Support Programme business development
 - Leiston Long Shop Museum (year 2)
