1 Welcome and Receive Apologies for Absence

The Chair welcomed all to the meeting at 2.00 pm and apologies were noted as above. He hoped that the current Covid-19 situation will improve sufficiently for the next meeting to be held in the Village Hall in Cemaes. He introduced colleagues from Marick Communications who guided members through the process of conducting the meeting via Zoom.

2. Approval of Minutes of the Meeting held 24 September 2020

The minutes had been circulated prior to the meeting. The minutes were received and accepted as a true record.

3 Matters Arising from the Previous Minutes

4 SSG Chairman's Report

The Chair gave an overview of activities since the last meeting noting that meetings had been held virtually:-

- The proposed review by the ONR on SSG roles and responsibilities will not take place, however, the NDA intend to undertake a review in due course.
- SSG Chairs and Vice Chairs have had virtual meetings with the NDA.
- NDA working toward developing as one corporate body.

5 Wylfa Site Director's Report

Stuart Law presented his report, copies of which had been circulated prior to the meeting. The report is summarised as follows:-

Covid-19

- Mandatory to wear face coverings when in transit to all site communal areas from 4 November.
- Handful of positive cases within the workforce that were transmitted in the community not on site.
- Lateral flow testing trials will be rolled out to all sites under the BEIS testing programme that supports critical national infrastructure. The introduction of these weekly tests is intended to identify people who are infectious with Covid-19 but are showing no symptoms and are therefore not aware. Volunteers are being recruited to support the programme which is expected to start in February.

Site progress

- A significant milestone was reached in September as a contract with Scottish Power Energy Networks was agreed for the electrical overlay connection. This will change the way electrical power is distributed to the site and is a key enabler to support future decommissioning work such as demolishing the turbine hall.
- The first shipment of radioactive waste since the operational pause left site in September. It contained just under five tonnes of metallic waste which was generated from a number of maintenance activities, waste clearance projects and the dry store cell four recovery work. The shipment was consigned to Cyclife for recycling.
- Redundant sea water pipe sections that were first used in 2008 as a backup supply during the replacement of a section of the sea water cooling ring main have been removed using a mechanical grab and burning equipment. The 43.5 tonne steel consignment was sent to North Wales supplier Lelo Metals for recycling.

- The site's four part compliance maintenance schedule was implemented in October which aligns Wylfa to the other Magnox sites and has removed thousands of activities that are no longer required.
- The waste operations team safely completed the task of retrieving 69,000 litres of effluent that originated from the active incinerator building floor drains and the incinerator exhaust scrubber wash drain.
- The intermediate level waste characterisation project has progressed significantly with over 200 samples taken from the burst can detection system and samples completed in the auxiliary gas system. These have been packaged and sent to a laboratory for analysis. The project's current focus is the spent fuel flask handling facility.
- The chiller units from 16 cold junction cubicles located in each reactor have been drained of oil, cleaned out and removed for off-site disposal as hazardous waste.
- The CO2 plant has been isolated in preparation for demolition.
- The first Environment, Health, Safety, Security and Quality review for two years was held in November which went really well. The Magnox Executive in attendance noted: strong support for the Covid-19 arrangements and outstanding TRIR/DACR safety performance. The Executive were impressed with the way the Construction Office was set-up and running, good control of lifting equipment and the maintenance optimisation project.
- A very successful virtual site tour of Trawsfynydd and Wylfa sites were held in December attended by NDA CEO David Peattie, Dr Ros Rivaz, NDA Chair and Magnox CEO Gwen Parry Jones, MBE.
- As from 1 February 2021, the Facilities Management services for Magnox sites will change from Interserve to Mitie. I'd like to thank Interserve for their many years of support at Wylfa and Maentwrog.

Safety performance

Total recorded incident rate (TRIR): 0.00 Days away case rate (DACR): 0.00 No of days since a lost time accident: 926 (27.01.21)

People

There are currently 155 workers at Wylfa. The Magnox Support Office staff who have a desk on site continue to work from home on an ongoing basis. Flu vaccinations, administered by BUPA, were made available to the workforce in November.

Mental Health

This is a key priority and part of the organisational strategy. The company is taking part in Mind's workplace mental health index this year. The workforce will be invited to take part in a wellbeing survey, the results of which will highlight how well the mental health policies, procedures and initiatives such as mental health first aiders are working and how they can be improved.

The Chair thanked Mr Law for his report and also for the £25K support received to facilitate community support for Covid-19.

Question and Answer Session

Cllr Derek Owen, as Chair of Llanbadrig Community Council, wished to commend the safety aspect of 926 days without an accident and thanked Magnox for the support given to the community during this time.

The Chair agreed that Item 11 on the Agenda would be discussed at this point in order to facilitate the presenters other work commitments. He welcomed Mr Tudur Jones from the Isle of Anglesey County Council

11 North Anglesey Regeneration Plan - update

Mr Tudur Jones gave a presentation on progress with the North Anglesey Regeneration Plan.

He drew particular attention to the following:-

Current Overview of North Anglesey

- Population – 13,474
- 60% Welsh speaking
- Amlwch – 3,789
- Ageing population (43.4% ages 45 to 74)
- 71% economically active
- 66% in employment (75% for Anglesey)
- Average income <£25,000 pa
- Most of coast is AONB designation

The Economic Decline

He noted that a number of major employers had been lost over recent years – Magnox; Rehau; Great Lakes and Horizon.

The Economic Impact

- 350+ workers lived in area
- Impact on local supply chain spend
- Skilled workforce lost
- Lack of entry level roles
- Impact on communities and young people
- Covid-19
- Formal withdrawal from the DCO process by Hitachi/ Horizon

Over £45m annual GVA lost

North Anglesey Regeneration Plan

TJ summarised the steps taken with the Regeneration Plan as follows -

- Consultation undertaken during June & July 2018
- 700+ responses received
- County Councils & Medrwn Môn Place Shaping activates
- Engagement with Community & Town Councils
- Discussions held with land owners
- Reports commissioned in order to scope the economic impact

NDA Year 1 Overview

The following was undertaken within the £110,000 allocated budget in order to deliver on identified priorities:

- Apprenticeship Framework
- Enterprise Zone Justification Paper
- Streetscape Study
- Amlwch Port Regeneration Study

- North Anglesey Destination Action Plan
- North Anglesey Grants Fund

NDA – Grant Support Fund

TJ also referred to the above additional grant support

- £50,000 allocated
- Max of £5,000 per applicant (80%)
- 11 businesses & community groups supported
 - 39 jobs created/ safeguarded
 - 30 training opportunities
 - 96 volunteering opportunities
- Intention to replicate and increase the values in Year 2

Additional Covid NDA Grant Support

An additional £25,000 grant was secured in order to support the community during the COVID 19 pandemic which was allocated as follows:-

- Activity packs for 297 children
- Two 3D printers for Ysgol Syr Thomas Jones for PPE
- Support Amlwch Foodbank and the 'Neges' (Menter Môn) food distribution project

NDA Year 2 Proposals

As regards Year 2 an application has been submitted for £192,000. The scope of works and activities include:

- North Anglesey Grants 2
- Integrated Signage Strategy & Real-time Visitor Data
- LoRaWAN & Internet of Things Pilot
- Urban Parkland & Public Realm Improvement (Porth Amlwch)
- Update and Improve the Visit Anglesey Website
- A Northerly Location

Virginia Crosbie MP for Anglesey thanked TJ for his update. She referred to the recent news regarding Wylfa Newydd noting it was exceptionally disappointing in light of the work already undertaken by the North Anglesey Partnership. She referred to the Prime Ministers 10 Point Plan and the Energy White Paper reiterating her clear commitment to nuclear energy and to working on behalf of the residents of Anglesey to seek meaningful employment. As regards Wylfa Newydd, she stated that Kwasi Kwarteng, Secretary of State for Business Energy and Industrial Strategy is working to bring another developer to the table and has agreed to a Zoom meeting with the SSG.

The Chair requested that Community Council representation be ensured on any proposed local Zoom discussions with the Secretary of State. He also enquired as to whether the UK Government had considered NDA purchase of the site as custodians. VC confirmed that Anne Marie Trevelyan MP has been appointed as the Minister for Business Energy and Clean Growth is working with Kwasi Kwarteng on future developments.

Cllr. Llinos Medi wished to thank TJ for an excellent presentation and stated that receipt of 700 responses to the consultation was very encouraging. She was also heartened to understand that the Anglesey Freeport and Restoring your Railways work undertaken by Isle of Anglesey staff was being supported by the Islands' MP. Details of the proposed year 2 grant support was also encouraging to safeguard jobs. She stated that she raises the issues around North Anglesey with Welsh Government at every given opportunity.

The Chair noted that a loss of £45m GVA to North Anglesey is huge and that the solutions lie in Westminster. He also wished to thank Ifer Gwyn, Horizon for all the work he has undertaken at Wylfa and invited him to speak.

Ifer Gwyn hoped that this meeting of the SSG would not be his last; however, he thanked the Chair for his words of appreciation. He believed that the lessons learnt over the past few years would serve to help achieve the best solution for North Anglesey.

Question and Answer Session

Cllr. Jac Jones, Mechell Community Council thanked TJ for his presentation and noted that the practical things being achieved was to be welcomed and looked forward, as a local Community Council, to working closely with IoACC regarding future developments.

Query received via the Zoom chat facility

Visit Anglessey website – how can that be influenced locally? TJ confirmed that further work on the website is scheduled for the next financial year, however, he also welcomed any local input and invited members to contact him directly.

Cllr. Dafydd Griffiths Llanelian Community Council also wished to thank TJ for the presentation and looked forward to joint working with the IoACC.

Cllr Derek Owen, Llanbadrig Community Council asked VC about the UK Governments commitment to net zero emissions by 2050 and their commitment to electric vehicles by 2030 and was this achievable without establishing new nuclear sites. VC acknowledged that these issues required further exploration and discussion.

6. Site Emergency Arrangements

Mr Stuart Law presented a brief report on the reviewed Site Emergency arrangements. He noted that the change to working times allowed for flexibility in Covid-19 requirements by introducing staggered attendance. He assured members that there was an emergency scheme in place to ensure that any foreseeable issues could be dealt with in conjunction with the emergency services.

The reviewed arrangements were noted by members.

Question and Answer session

7 Nuclear Decommissioning Authority

Mr J McNamara and Mr J Jenkin were welcomed to the meeting. JJ gave a brief summary of the report previously circulated to members.

Covid-19

- NDA Group continues to respond to the impacts of the Covid pandemic
- Good progress in restarting site operations across the NDA Group since the first lockdown
- Reduction in staff presence at some sites (e.g. Sellafield)
- NDA Corporate Centre staff continuing to work from home except essential office access
- Health, safety and wellbeing of staff remains our top priority.

Recent Appointments

- New Chair, Ros Rivaz, started with the NDA on 1 September 2020.
- Appointment of Francis Livens to NDA Board who has over 35 years' experience in nuclear research
- Appointment of Mark Rouse as MD of Dounreay Site Restoration Ltd from 1 April
- Appointment of Martin Walkingshaw as CEO Designate of Low Level Waste Repository (LLWR)

Draft Business Plan 2021-24

- Draft business plan published on 8 December 2020 for 8 week public consultation
- Sets out NDA Group spending plans and priorities for financial years 2021 – 2024
- Incorporates outcome of 2020 Spending Review settlement
- Consultation ended on 2 February 2021
- Final draft submitted to UK and Scottish Ministers for approval with a publication date of 31.3.21

Nuclear Transport Solutions

- Single transport division bringing together transport expertise and capabilities across the NDA Group.
- Will begin operating as a single organisation on 1 February ahead of its full launch in April.
- Transportation of spent fuel, nuclear materials, return of reprocessing products to overseas customers, packaging and licensing support to NDA Group
- Intention to create a single waste division (LLWR and RWM).

GDF Working Groups

- Radioactive Waste Management (RWM) has welcomed the formation of the first two Working Groups in Copeland and Allerdale
- Important steps in the Geological Disposal Facility (GDF) programme
- Working Groups will begin local discussions and fact-finding about potentially siting a GDF in Copeland and Allerdale
- Does not guarantee that a GDF will be sited in Cumbria or preclude other communities from establishing Working Groups.

Draft Energy Strategy

- The Strategy is a statutory requirement of the Energy Act has to be reviewed at least every 5 years
- Current Strategy was published in 2016
- Draft Strategy 4 published for public consultation from 17 August – 8 November
- Final approved Strategy published by 31 March 2021.

Consultation and next steps

- Approximately 73 sets of comments from a range of stakeholders.
- We have carefully considered all comments and, where possible, taken them into account in the final draft
- Final draft has been submitted to UK and Scottish Ministers for approval
- Final Strategy will be published by 31 March 2021 with consultation response document.

JJ also noted that the Sellafield Chair had been recently appointed and further details will be shared with the SSG members via the Chair.

8 Office for Nuclear Regulation Update

Mr Ian Dallas was welcomed to the meeting and presented his report. It was summarised as follows:-

- ONR inspectors attended Wylfa site on the following dates: 28th July 2020; 25th to 28th August 2020; 16th September 2020; 24th September 2020; 5th October 2020; and 16th to 19th November 2020
- ONR carried out inspections at Wylfa, and in general, judged the arrangements made and implemented by the site in response to safety and security requirements to be adequate in the areas inspected.
- Throughout this reporting period, including the period of national lockdown, ONR's nominated site safety inspector has held weekly telephone meetings with a Wylfa leadership team representative to maintain situational awareness on matters related to nuclear safety, security, safeguards, transport and conventional and health and safety. No significant issues were highlighted to ONR and so, since August, the frequency of these telephone meetings has reduced to fortnightly. This includes now undertaking some interactions by remote conference calls (as appropriate) to minimise physical presence on the site.
- Wylfa has not reported any safety related incidents to ONR during this reporting period.
- The site has undertaken work to ensure personnel can return to site in a safe and secure manner. Emergency preparedness is maintained through a duty cover team in accordance with ONR approved emergency arrangements.

9 Natural Resources Wales / Environmental Agency Update

Iwan Williams, NRW and Rona Arckle, EA were welcomed to the meeting. IW introduced himself as the NRW Operational Lead for both Wylfa and Trawsfynydd sites. He explained that the NRW and EA undertook a joint role in regulatory responsibilities.

RA went on to summarise the report previously circulated to members.

She noted that :

- The report covers the period since September 2020.
- Wylfa site has not been visited in person since work at site resumed following the operational pause last year, but, regular weekly calls have been held to discuss the site's status and any emerging issues and have carried out a number of remote inspections.
- All the buildings at Wylfa except the Reactor Equipment Building (REB) are expected to be deplanted and demolished to slab level before the site enters Care & Maintenance. This removal of administrative and ancillary buildings is expected to start in 2021 and will take place in four phases over the next few years.
- Another project to clear non-fixed equipment from the REB and finish post-operational clean-out (POCO) of facilities which stored fuel and bulk chemicals (used when Wylfa was generating) is also in progress.

- The Project Waste Management Plan (PWMP) process appears to be working well at an individual project, or project phase, level. A number of other processes – for example, use of the Waste Authority Review (WAR) process – are currently being established at Wylfa.
- There have been no significant environmental events at Wylfa during this reporting period. We have not taken any enforcement action in the period since the last report. However, we are currently considering a couple of events relating to solid radioactive waste management.

Question and Answer session

10 Magnox Socio-Economic Scheme Update

Mair Jones was welcomed to the meeting and wished to thank Tudur Jones for his presentation noting that it provided a clear update on the progress made to date by the NDA Programme.

MJ explained that Magnox has been shortlisted for three prestigious Nuclear Skills Academy for Nuclear (NSAN) awards for its work in 2020. The first award, for Magnox's outstanding Covid-19 community response, which will be decided by a public vote. In March 2020, Magnox made £25,000 available per site from the Magnox Socio-economic scheme. Members were also shown a short video highlighting the work undertaken across the UK to support communities. Members were requested to pledge their vote by 25 March 2021, and to also encourage other community groups that have been supported by visiting the following website: <https://www.nsan.co.uk/page/MagnoxCommunityAwardFinalist>. The company has also been nominated for its notable ED&I work and for its recruitment of apprentices, in partnership with Energus and National College for Nuclear.

The Chair thanked MJ for sight of the inspirational video and thanked Magnox staff for their support during these difficult times. He also encouraged members to cast their vote, via the website noted above, before 25 March 2021.

MJ went on to give an update on the Social Economic Scheme since the last meeting.

- Bwyd Da Môn is an exciting new organisation that has grown out of collaboration between many organisations including Anglesey County Council, Betsi Cadwaladr University Health Board, Ynys Môn Citizens Advice, Coleg Llandrillo Menai and Anglesey Food Bank. They recently received £8,540 from Magnox to purchase industrial fridges and freezers to assist with the initial set up. The community hub has been developed in Llangefni around the concept of a not-for-profit shop, which re-distributes leftover produce from a range of supermarkets and food producers. Excess food is collected from local food suppliers that would otherwise have gone to landfill. The shop is a membership-based food club, which costs £5 per week, and is open to all.
- Multi year Socio-economic funded projects update - although the first year was hugely impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic, a number of studies were successfully commissioned. A Business Case was produced for an Enterprise Zone justification for the former Octel site and Amlwch Industrial Estate. An Amlwch Port Regeneration Masterplan has been produced outlining redevelopment opportunities for the area along with a Destination Action Plan, identifying visitor attractions in a coherent plan. £50,000 was also allocated to a North Anglesey Grant Fund which saw 11 organisations supported, resulting in 39 jobs created/secured, 30 training opportunities

and 96 volunteering opportunities. Amongst some supported were Caru Amlwch, Llanbadrig Vineyard and a young fisherman who took over his father's business.

- STEM Gogledd Project received £201,000 Magnox funding over four years covering Anglesey, Gwynedd and Conwy. The project is progressing well despite the mentors having to revert to virtual sessions, with over 300 pupils registered with the project in the first six months prior to the March lockdown, of which 59% female intake. Almost 600 pupils have participated in organised interventions.
- Môn CF have just successfully completed their third and final year of their 'Next Steps' project with £300,000 of funding from Magnox. This funding allowed the continuation of the academy services whilst transitioning to the new premises by supporting the roles of the academy delivery manager and two full time training co-ordinators. Magnox funding also helped Môn CF leverage an additional £480,000 to purchase and extensively refurbish their main HQ office and hub.

Cllr Derek Owen and Cllr Gordon Warren expressed gratitude on behalf of their respective communities for the support and hard work undertaken by Magnox staff volunteers to ease the burden of Covid-19.

13. **Any Other Business**

- Cllr. Dafydd Griffiths noted that he had presented questions regarding the Holliday Report to officers via Jill Callander with a request for a written response but none received to date. JJ stated that the final Holliday Report publication date is yet to be agreed but may now be hampered by the pandemic. However, the HM Treasury minute of the government's response to the public accounts committee report would be circulated. **Action:** JJ to circulate the aforementioned HM Treasury minute to the group and for Cllr. Dafydd Griffiths' questions to be included in the meeting minutes as follows:

The minutes of the last meeting noted the following:

“With regard to the Holliday Report, he noted that the date of publication is yet to be agreed with COVID 19 restrictions being an additional contributing factor to the delay. He did note, however, that the delay has no implications on the work of the NDA.”

The Nov 2020 Public Accounts Committee report notes the following:

*“We asked the Department about the progress of the **Holliday inquiry** into the failure of the Magnox procurement and contract which was launched in 2018, and of **the Department's 'Tailored Review' of the role and governance of the NDA**. The Department committed to ensuring that these reports are completed and published as a priority, and said it expected the **Holliday report to be published imminently** and **the Tailored Review by the end of the year**. It said that the delays with the Holliday inquiry had been due to a number of legal challenges related to the inquiry, but that the Department had accepted all the conclusions of the inquiry's interim report and the most important forward-looking actions recommended in that report had now been taken. The Department also confirmed it would comply with the recommendation of our 2018 report on the Magnox contract to write to us within six months of publication of*

the Holliday inquiry with progress on the implementation of the inquiry's recommendations."

I appreciate that the publication of the Holliday inquiry and the Tailored Review are in the hands of the Government. However, the Public Accounts Committee note a specific recommendation for action by the NDA. Could NDA provide an update?

"On publication of the Holliday report and tailored review, the Department and the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority should set out publicly what has been learnt from them and how the reports are being used to inform the development of the new delivery and governance models."

*Having read the Public Accounts Committee Nov 2020 report on the **"decommissioning of the Magnox sites and broader strategic challenges facing the Department and the NDA"** I believe a specific update on these matters from NDA would be of interest to SSG members.*

How does the NDA intend to respond to the following recommendations contained in the Public Accounts Committee report? I have reordered the recommendations to prioritise those that are, in my view, of most interest and significance locally.

Recommendations:

"NDA should be more transparent about its current and future plans with the local communities surrounding its 17 sites to strengthen public accountability and make clear the socioeconomic impact of its planned activities."

"The Nuclear Decommissioning Authority should also set out how it will prioritise its work on its sites in order to decommission them in the safest and most efficient way."

"Within 6 months of publication of this report, the Department and the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority should publish a detailed plan for how they plan to meet the demand for skills across the UK nuclear industry over the next 5–10 years."

"The Nuclear Decommissioning Authority should set out how it will develop a clearer means of reporting publicly on the level of uncertainty and risk across its sites."

"Taking into account the feedback from its public consultation, the Nuclear Decommissioning Authority should exploit opportunities to reduce the time taken to decommission its sites, and should identify the impact of such reductions on the cost profile."

"The Nuclear Decommissioning Authority and the Department should make it a priority to progress their plans to find a location for a Geological Disposal Facility in order to reduce interim storage costs at Sellafield and elsewhere, and should confirm when they consider such a Facility might feasibly become available for the storage of waste."

The Chair thanked all for their attendance and closed the meeting at 15:36.

Eglurodd MJ fod Magnox ar y rhestr fer ar gyfer tair o wobrau pwysig Academi Sgiliau Niwclear y Diwydiant Niwclear (NSAN) am ei waith yn 2020. Mae'r gyntaf am ymateb cymunedol neilltuol Magnox i Covid-19, a fydd yn cael ei dyfarnu'n dilyn pleidlais gyhoeddus. Ym mis Mawrth 2020, dyfarnodd Magnox £25,000 i bob un o'i safleoedd o gynllun economaidd-gymdeithasol Magnox. Dangoswyd fideo byr i'r aelodau a oedd yn dangos y gwaith a wnaed ledled y DU i helpu cymunedau. Gofynnwyd i aelodau gofio pleidleisio erbyn 25 Mawrth 2021, a hefyd i annog grwpiau cymunedol eraill sydd wedi cael help drwy fynd i'r wefan ganlynol:

Aeth MJ ymlaen i gyflwyno diweddariad ar y Cynllun Economaidd-gymdeithasol ers y cyfarfod diwethaf.

- Mae Bwyd Da Môn yn fudiad newydd cyffrous sydd wedi deillio o gydweithrediad nifer o sefydliadau, gan gynnwys Cyngor Sir Ynys Môn, Bwrdd Iechyd Prifysgol Betsi Cadwaladr, Cyngor ar Bopeth Ynys Môn, Coleg Llandrillo Menai a Banc Bwyd Môn. Yn ddiweddar cawsant £8,540 gan Magnox i brynu oergelloedd a rhewgelloedd diwydiannol i helpu i sefydlu'r fenter. Datblygwyd y ganolfan gymunedol yn Llangefni yn seiliedig ar siop nid er elw, sy'n aildosbarthu cynnyrch dros ben o nifer o archfarchnadoedd a chynhyrchwyr bwyd. Mae bwyd dros ben yn cael ei gasglu o gyflenwyr bwyd lleol a fyddai fel arall yn diweddu mewn safleoedd tirlenwi. Mae'r siop yn glwb bwyd i aelodau, sy'n costio £5 yr wythnos, ac mae'n agored i bawb.
- Diweddariad ar brosiectau aml-flwyddyn a ariennir - er bod y flwyddyn gyntaf wedi'i heffeithio'n ddrwg gan y pandemig Covid-19, llwyddwyd i gomisiynu sawl astudiaeth lwyddiannus. Cynhyrchwyd Achos Busnes ar gyfer cyfiawnhau Parth Busnes ar gyfer yr hen safle Octel ac Ystâd Ddiwydiannol Amlwch. Cafodd Cynllun Meistr Adfywio Porthladd Amlwch ei gynhyrchu sy'n amlinellu cyfleoedd ailddatblygu ar gyfer yr ardal ynghyd â Chynllun Gweithredu Cyrchfan, sy'n nodi atyniadau i ymwelwyr mewn cynllun

ystyrlon. Dyfarnwyd £50,000 hefyd i Gronfa Grant Gogledd Môn sydd wedi cefnogi 11 o sefydliadau, gan arwain at greu/sicrhau 39 o swyddi, 30 o gyfleoedd hyfforddi a 96 o gyfleoedd gwirfoddoli. Ymhlith y rhai a gefnogwyd mae Caru Amlwch, Gwinllan Llanbadrig a physgotwr ifanc sydd wedi cymryd busnes ei dad.

- Cafodd y Prosiect STEM Gogledd £201,000 gan Magnox dros gyfnod o bedair blynedd i weithio ym Môn, Gwynedd a Chonwy.
